**Explanatory Memorandum**

The object of this Bill is to amend the Bus Industry Employees Welfare Fund Act so as –

- (a) to provide for an increase in the rate of monthly contribution payable to the Bus Industry Employees Welfare Fund by bus operators and employees of the bus industry; and
- (b) give the Minister the power to amend, after consultation with the Board, the Schedules by way of regulations.

## **A BILL**

### **To amend the Bus Industry Employees Welfare Fund Act**

ENACTED by the Parliament of Mauritius, as follows –

#### **1. Short title**

This Act may be cited as the Bus Industry Employees Welfare Fund (Amendment) Act 2017.

#### **2. Interpretation**

In this Act –

“principal Act” means the Bus Industry Employees Welfare Fund Act.

#### **3. Section 25 of principal Act amended**

Section 25 of the principal Act is amended by repealing subsection (2) and replacing it by the following subsection –

(2) Any regulations made under subsection (1) may provide for –

(a) the levying of fees and charges;

(b) the amendment of Schedules.

#### **4. First Schedule to principal Act repealed and replaced**

The First Schedule to the principal Act is repealed and replaced by the First Schedule set out in the Schedule to this Act.

#### **5. Commencement**

This Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by proclamation.
