A BILL

To amend the Criminal Code by creating the offence of Culpable Omission

ENACTED by the Parliament of Mauritius, as follows -

1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the Criminal Code (Amendment) Act 2006.

2. Interpretation

In this Act –

"principal Act" means the Criminal Code.

3. New section 39A inserted in the principal Act

The Criminal Code is amended by inserting, immediately after section 39, the following new section –

39A. Culpable Omission

(1) (1) Any person who is able to Quiconque pouvant empêcher par son action take prompt action, without risk to himself or to a third immédiate, sans risque pour lui ni pour les tiers, party, so as to prevent the soit un fait qualifié crime, commission of a crime, or délit a misdemeanour which is soit un contre l'intégrité corporelle de la an offence against personne. s'abstient persons, and who willfully volontairement de le faire, fails to do so,

shall be punished by a fine not exceeding 10,000 rupees and by imprisonment for a term not exceeding 2 years.

- (2) Quiconque, s'abstient (2) volontairement de porter à une personne en péril l'assistance que, sans risque pour lui ni pour les tiers, il pouvait lui porter, soit par son action personnelle soit en provoquant un secours,
 - Any person who wilfully omits to provide to a person in danger such assistance as he could, without any risk to himself or to a third party, provide to that person by his own intervention or by calling for help,

shall be punished by a fine not exceeding 10,000 rupees and by imprisonment for a term not exceeding 2 years.

(3) Subsection (2) shall be in addition to and not in derogation of section 140 of the Road Traffic Act.
