**Private Notice Question**

I have to inform you that the Honourable Leader of the Opposition, Mr Paul Raymond Bérenger, GCSK, MP, has given notice of the following Private Notice Question which he proposes to put to Dr the Honourable Minister of Agro Industry and Fisheries at the sitting to be held today, **Tuesday 11 December 2007 at 11.30 a.m.**

*To ask Dr the Honourable Minister of Agro Industry and Fisheries:-*

**Whether, in regard to the African Swine Fever epidemic, he will state –**

- (a) how many pigs have been disposed of as at todate;**
- (b) if new cases are being detected and, if so, whether all remaining pigs will have to be disposed of;**
- (c) whether fair compensation per pig disposed of will now be paid, as recommended by the experts of the World Animal Health Organisation and more recently, of the Food Agricultural Organisation; and**
- (d) if pig breeders will be allotted land to re-launch their activities?**
