Private Notice Question

I have to inform you that the Honourable Leader of the Opposition, Mr Nandcoomar Bodha, MP, has given notice of the following Private Notice Question which he proposes to put to the Dr the Honourable Prime Minister, Minister of Defence, & Home Affairs, Minister of Civil Service & Administrative Reforms and Minister of Rodrigues & Outer Islands, at the sitting to be held today, **Tuesday 17 April 2007 at 11.30 a.m.**

To ask Dr the Honourable Prime Minister, Minister of Defence & Home Affairs, Minister of Civil Service & Administrative Reforms and Minister of Rodrigues & Outer Islands:-

Whether, in regard to the law and order situation in the country, he will state –

- (a) the figures as from June 2006 to date relating to –**
 - (i) murder, manslaughter, larceny with violence, sexual offences, indicating cases where minors have been victims, and child prostitution;**
 - (ii) cases of illegal bill posting;**
 - (iii) unlawful gatherings;**
- (b) the specific measures adopted to curb cases of illegal bill posting and unlawful gatherings; and**
- (c) any measures other than those already announced and implemented?**
