Private Notice Question

I have to inform you that the Honourable Leader of the Opposition, Mr Paul Raymond Bérenger, GCSK, MP, has given notice of the following Private Notice Question which he proposes to put to Dr the Honourable Prime Minister, Minister of Defence, Home Affairs and External Communications at the sitting to be held today, **Tuesday 21 June 2011 at 11.30 a.m.**

To ask Dr the Honourable Prime Minister, Minister of Defence, Home Affairs and External Communications –

Whether, in regard to pedestrian crossings, he will –

(a) for the benefit of the House, obtain from the Commissioner of Police, information, since 2005 to-date, on a yearly basis, as to the number of pedestrians –

- (i) killed; and**
- (ii) injured,**

in accidents, when crossing on same, indicating in each case –

- (i) the age of the victim and of the driver, indicating if the driver was previously convicted of road traffic offences;**
- (ii) if it was a case of hit and run; and**
- (iii) the outcome of the court case;**

(b) state the additional measures that will be taken, including amendments to the existing legislation, in relation thereto, for the safety of the users thereof?
