The 66th Conference of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association brought together over 500 delegates - Speakers/Presiding Officers, parliamentary staff and decision makers from across the Commonwealth countries to address critical issues facing today's Parliaments.

In his keynote address during the opening ceremony on Wednesday 04 October 2023, His Excellency Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo, President of the Republic of Ghana and Vice-Patron of the CPA underscored the need for Parliaments to come together and to foster international cooperation through diplomacy. The bid is to advocate for democracy, justice and human rights for all.

Participants had the opportunity to explore the following topical issues:

- The threat of terrorism to statehood: the role of Parliament
- Gender Quotas in Parliament a means to an end?
- What does Sustainable trade and economic development mean for small iurisdictions?
- Youth Roundtable: Role of the Commonwealth in international security and peacebuilding
- Environmental approaches in tackling energy poverty
- 20 Years of the Latimer House Principles on the Separation of Powers: Is it working?
- The Commonwealth Charter: A Charter for all Human Rights, or just some?
- E-Parliaments: An effective mechanism for intersectional diversity and equitable public engagement?

The Conference will be concluded with the deliberations of the General Assembly on Thursday 05 October 2023.
