ARRANGEMENT OF CLAUSES

Clause

1. Short title
2. Appropriation of sums for supplementary expenditure in respect of services of Government

A BILL

To provide for the supplementary appropriation, by votes of expenditure, both recurrent and capital, in respect of services of Government for the financial year 2022-2023, in excess of the expenditure appropriated by the Appropriation (2022-2023) Act 2022

ENACTED by the Parliament of Mauritius, as follows –

1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (2022-2023) Act 2023.

2. Appropriation of sums for supplementary expenditure in respect of services of Government

(1) A total sum not exceeding five billion and four hundred and seventeen million rupees (Rs 5,417,000,000) in respect of the vote of expenditure, both recurrent and capital, specified in the Schedule, being the total sum in excess of the expenditure appropriated by the Appropriation (2022-2023) Act 2022, shall be appropriated to meet the supplementary expenditure in respect of the services of Government for the financial year 2022-2023.

(2) The expenditure of the total sum under subsection (1) shall be appropriated by votes of expenditure, in conformity with the Schedule and the Estimates of Supplementary Expenditure (2022-2023) of 2023 laid before the Assembly.
